At the onset of the year, we set several goals, and achieved them all! These included increasing public awareness of the Friends, building membership, raising money to enable the Library to better serve our community, and putting on educational programs for the entire community to enjoy.

Our success would not have been possible without the participation of so many people and some special thank you's are in order. I'd like to thank the 2006 Executive Board, a group of creative. hardworking, and dedicated volunteers, Community Library Manager Laura Frakes and her staff, and the Culver City City Council and City staff members for their ongoing support. Special thanks to the Culver City Fire Department, whose unique involvement with the Friends in 2006 really stands out. And, of course, we thank all the businesses, organizations, Friends of the Library members, and community members who volunteered their time and services, donated money, and participated in our activities.

Over the past year, we developed new programs and continued several of our existing ones. Having served as President of this organization for the past two years, I'm thrilled to pass on the gavel to incoming President Alan Corlin and thank him for stepping up from Vice President to take on this challenging position. 
## What the Friends Have Been Up To...

The Culver City Friends of the Library recently took on the exciting task of preparing a cookbook that we've entitled "A Treasure Chest of Recipes." The cookbook features 250 favorite recipes, is beautifully illustrated, easy-to-read, professionally printed and bound, and sure to be treasured for

years.

Sincere thanks to everyone who contributed a treasured recipe for this cookbook. The Friends of the Library strives to get everyone involved in the Library and we are so pleased that this "Community Cookbook" project truly reflects the involvement of the residents of the Culver City community at large, including their family and friends. Contributors include current and former
