New Mobile App

From October 9th to Election Day the library, as well as the City Clerks office at City Hall, are among 150 locations were voters can drop off their ballot. Also, the library will serve as a polling site on Tuesday, November 6.

Makmo Comes to the Library...



MakMo vehicles are a new delivery system to support Makerspaces and to promote Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math (STEM) programs. MakMo is equipped with STEM-based learning technology and provides hands on learning to include aspects of computer coding, robotics, engineering, and science. Culver City Julian Dixon Library will host Makmo every third Thursday of the month at 3:45 PM at our weekly Kids' Club program.



In March, MakMo brought cublets robot blocks to teach children about robot construction using sense, action, and think blocks. In addition, children also learned

about electronics and circuits by designing and building models of working electronic circuits with snap circuits. We had a great turnout with 72 participants including parents and children. All were excited and engaged and expressed interest in future programs. In May, Makmo Librarian, Jennifer will bring Ozobots and Keva planks to teach children about coding and construction. Stay tuned to see what other STEMbased programs MakMo has in store!

About the Actors' Gang...

@ CULVER CITY JULIAN DIXON LIBRARY!

Our partnership with the Actors' Gang, the critically acclaimed (and nationally renowned) theater company heading by actor Tim Robbins, first began in late 2016, when they approached us to present a monthly play reading series at the Culver City Julian Dixon Library. The Gang proposed coming to the library monthly, to read scenes from a different Pulitzer Prize-winning play, which would then be given a more complete reading a few weeks later at the Gang's theater home at the Ivy Substation. In the seasons since, the program has become a beloved one here at the Culver City Julian Dixon Library, with a devoted cadre of regular fans from our community attending each reading.

It has been a win-win for all of us: As a not-for-profit theater company headquartered in Culver City, the Actors Gang is certainly part of our community, and we welcomed the opportunity to add a cultural and artistic program for our customers and visitors. The Gang was also pleased to have the chance to reach a different audience than the one coming regularly to their shows at the theater.

The first play that they read scenes from in our meeting room was Tony Kushner's *Angels in America*. In subsequent months, they've read scenes from classic American plays such as Marsha Norman's 'Night Mother and Suzi Lori-Parks's *Topdog/Underdog*. After the readings, which are as powerful, funny, and dramatic as one would expect from performers of the company's caliber, the actors engage in spirited conversation with members of the audience, discussing the themes and issues underlying each play. The readings provide a chance for our customers to experience world-class theater without having to go further than the library's meeting room.

This year they've been reading plays by acclaimed women writers, and although the group has scaled back to performing only once every two months, they have indicated that they'd like to start again on a monthly basis next season. In the months ahead, we're also hoping to amp up our own promotional agenda so that more folks will come and enjoy these amazing readings.

We certainly hope you'll come for a wonderful night of theater with the Actors Gang at the Culver City Julian Dixon Library!

The next reading, 1964's *Dutchman*, by Leroi Jones (later known as Amiri Baraka) is Wednesday, November 7 at 6 pm.

Set on a New York City subway train, Dutchman is a two-character con- frontation between Clay, a well-dressed, intellectual African American man and Lulu, a beautiful, flirtatious white woman which begins playfully but builds rapidly in suspense and symbolism before lurching into dispassionate ruthlessness. Winner of the 1964 OBIE Award for Best American Play. Adults Only.

Given that Culver City has been referred to as "The Heart of Screenland," it stands to reason that its library should offer related programming. And, thanks to the continued generosity of the Culver City Friends of the Library which has invested in the movie licenses required for public exhibition, patrons of our library have been able to enjoy feature film screenings for over a year in the small theater setting that the Meeting Room provides. During the past months we've presented adult fare like *The King's Speech, La La Land, Bridge of Spies, Dunkirk, Baby Driver,* and *The Darkest Hour;* and for the kids we've shown *Zootopia, Jungle Book, Finding Dory, Moana,* and more. Future screenings include *The Big Sick, Lady Bird,* and *All The Money In The World* for grown-ups and *The Last Jedi, Coco,* and *Black Panther* for the younger crowd.

Response to our movie programming has been very positive because our patrons get to take in films that they may have missed when they were first released. Here again our Friends deserve thanks, as they were the ones who purchased the blackout shades for the big windows and arranged for extra chairs beyond those initially available for use.
