BRICC: Building Readers In Culver City

Laing Urban, John Laing Homes' newest division specializing in urban development whose headquarters are located in Culver City, has generously agreed to sponsor our newest program: Building Readers In Culver City (BRICC). BRICC is a children's literacy program aimed at motivating children to read. The first session of the program begins on April 4, 2006, coinciding with National Library Week, and will continue through June 27, 2006. All winners and participants will be invited to an awards ceremony and party at the library on July 15, 2006.

BRICC rewards children for every ageappropriate book they read, by placing a "BRICC" featuring their name on the wall of the library. Acquiring ten "BRICCs" signals the building of an entire house. Prizes are awarded weekly for each BRICC. Grand prizes are also awarded at the end of contest to each child who completes a house. The entire program is free.

"We are proud of the BRICC program we built with the Culver City Friends of the Library" said Maria Salviati, Vice President of Sales and Marketing for Laing Urban. "At Laing Urban, we strive to be good neighbors and nothing is more neighborly than building a better future for the children of our community."

This session marks the start of the BRICC program which is intended to be a year round offering, with three 12week sessions spread throughout the year.

We thought we would share this recent thank you -- for one of the more unusual contributions made by the Friends – received from Gwendolyn Stevens, the Librarian in charge of Young Adult programs:

"Now that we're settled back in the library, I've had a chance to open the box of young adult books I purchased with the Friends' money in February. As I mentioned, a few weeks ago two teens from Culver High School told me that our library had the best manga collection out of all the libraries around. This really pleased me because manga (the term for Japanese comic books) is incredibly popular with teens--many "reluctant readers" voraciously read manga. Penny Winchester, my predecessor, created an excellent manga collection and I have tried to maintain and expand it--but I could not have done so without the Friends' generosity.

"In February I used the Friends' money to update and fill in some gaps in our manga collection; we now have the newest volumes in the "Case Closed," "King of Hell" and "Alice 19th" series, two new "Demon Diary" volumes, and the entire collection of the oft-requested "Love Hina" series. All these volumes are ones that the teens have asked for, and I am very grateful to the Friends for enabling us to provide them to the teens. The teens and I send you a big THANK YOU!!"

On Tuesday evening, February 7, 2006, the Friends of the Library story time and craft program featured Councilmember Alan Corlin and special guest, author and illustrator Martha Sigall. Ms. Sigall is the author of "Living Life inside the Lines: Tales from the Golden Age of Animation" and the recipient of numerous awards for her animation artistry. She is also a resident of Culver City and worked in animation production from 1936 to 1989, drawing all the classic cartoon characters we love - Bugs Bunny, Daffy Duck, Tom & Jerry, Droopy Dawg, Beany & Cecil, Tweety, and Porky Pig. This special children's program featured an animation demonstration, a short video presentation and beginner level arts and crafts. A great time was had by all!

On Tuesday evening, March 7, 2006, the Library and the Friends jointly presented a special story time with Councilmember Alan Corlin and a performance by the renowned theatrical troupe, "We Tell Stories" in honor of Dr. Seuss's birthday. The performance was "standing room only," with well over a hundred people participating in this fun, interactive event. 
